THE ARMY ACT, No. 17 OF 1949

REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs under section 155 of the Army Act, No. 17 of 1949.

Regulations

1. These regulations may be cited as the Army Medical and Dental Officers Regulations, 1961.

PART I—PAY

2. The pay of medical and dental officers in the Army shall be determined in accordance with the following provisions :—

(A) MEDICAL OFFICERS

- (1) A medical officer, who immediately prior to his appointment as such, was employed in Government Service, shall, on such appointment, be placed by the Commander of the Army at such point in the scale of pay specified in paragraph (3) of this regulation as will enable him to draw a pay which is not less than the pay he was last drawing as a government officer. Thereafter, his pay shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate provisions of that scale, irrespective of his rank.
- (2) A medical officer other than a medical officer referred to in paragraph (1) shall, on his appointment, be placed at a point in the scale of pay specified in paragraph (3) of this regulation which shall be determined by the Commander of the Army with the approval of the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury having regard to such officer's professional experience ; and thereafter his pay shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate provisions of that scale, irrespective of his rank.
- (3) (A) The scale of pay applicable to medical officers shall be as follows :—
 - (i) *Preliminary Grade*
Rs. 5,880 per annum rising up to Rs. 6,240 per annum by one annual increment of Rs. 360.
 - (ii) *Grade II*
Rs. 6,960 per annum rising up to Rs. 11,280 per annum by four annual increments of Rs. 360 each and six annual increments of Rs. 480 each.
 - (iii) *Grade I*
Rs. 11,760 per annum rising up to Rs. 13,200 per annum by three annual increments of Rs. 480 each.
 - (iv) *Special Grade*
Rs. 13,800 per annum rising up to Rs. 15,600 per annum by three annual increments of Rs. 600 each.
 - (v) *Full-time Specialists*
 - (a) *Fully qualified full-time specialists—*
A fully qualified specialist shall be paid the same pay as is payable to a medical officer in the Preliminary Grade, Grade II, or Grade I (the Grade being determined in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2)), and he shall be entitled to proceed to a maximum of Rs. 15,600 per annum by four annual increments of Rs. 600 each after he has reached the maximum of Rs. 13,200 payable to a Grade I medical officer.

(b) *Part-qualified full-time specialists—*

A part-qualified specialist shall be paid the same pay as is payable to a medical officer in the Preliminary Grade, Grade II, or Grade I (the Grade being determined in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2)), and he shall be entitled to proceed to a maximum of Rs. 14,400 per annum by two annual increments of Rs. 600 each after he has reached the maximum of Rs. 13,200 per annum payable to a Grade I medical officer.

- (B) The Preliminary Grade, Grade II, and Grade I shall be on a continuous time scale with a two-year halt on the maximum of Grade II. The Special Grade shall consist of only one post to which may be appointed any medical officer in the Army, Navy, or Air Force, if such medical officer—
- (i) is considered to be the most suitable medical officer for the post by virtue of his seniority, ability, qualifications, and experience,
 - (ii) holds a rank not below that of Lieutenant-Colonel, Surgeon Commander, or Wing Commander, and
 - (iii) has served for not less than three years on the maximum of the scale of salary of Grade I.
- (4) An officer appointed to act in a post in a higher grade than his own shall be entitled to receive acting pay in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Government.

(B) DENTAL OFFICERS

- (5) A dental officer, who immediately prior to his appointment as such, was in Government Service, shall, on such appointment, be placed by the Commander of the Army at such point in the scale of pay specified in paragraph (7) of this regulation as will enable him to draw a pay which is not less than the pay he was last drawing as a government officer. Thereafter, his pay shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate provisions of that scale, irrespective of his rank.
- (6) A dental officer other than a dental officer referred to in paragraph (5) shall, on his appointment, be placed at a point in the scale of pay specified in paragraph (7) of this regulation which shall be determined by the Commander of the Army with the approval of the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury having regard to such officer's professional experience; and thereafter his pay shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate provisions of that scale, irrespective of his rank.
- (7) (a) The scale of pay applicable to dental officers shall be as follows :—
- (i) *Grade II*
 Rs. 5,160 per annum rising up to Rs. 11,280 per annum by nine annual increments of Rs. 360 each and six annual increments of Rs. 480 each with a two year halt on Rs. 11,280.
 - (ii) *Grade I*
 Rs. 11,760 per annum rising up to Rs. 13,200 per annum by three annual increments of Rs. 480 each.
- (b) Grades II and I shall be on a continuous time scale with a two-year halt on the maximum of Grade II.

PART II—ALLOWANCES AND PENSIONS

3. The allowances payable to medical and dental officers shall be in accordance with the following provisions :—

(1) *Service Allowance*

A medical or a dental officer shall be entitled to receive a service allowance at such of the following rates as is appropriate to him having regard to his rank :—

Captain	}	Rs. 180 per month ;

(2) *Non-Pensionable Allowance*

A medical officer shall be entitled to receive a non-pensionable allowance in lieu of private practice at the following rates :—

(a) *Non-Specialists—*

- (i) *Preliminary Grade* Rs. 1,200 per annum.
- (ii) *Grade II* Rs. 1,200 per annum for the first six years, and Rs. 1,800 per annum thereafter.
- (iii) *Grade I* Rs. 1,800 per annum for the first four years ; Rs. 2,400 per annum for the next four years after the first four years ; Rs. 3,000 per annum for the next four years after the first eight years ; and Rs. 3,600 per annum thereafter.
- (iv) *Special Grade* Rs. 1,800 per annum.

(b) *Full-time specialists—*

(i) *Fully qualified full-time specialists—*

- Rs. 500 per month for a period of five years ;
 Rs. 750 per month for a period of ten years thereafter ; and
 Rs. 1,000 per month during the remainder of his period of service.

To be entitled to the full non-pensionable allowance, a fully qualified full-time specialist shall have obtained such specialist qualifications as are recognised by the Director of Health Services, and have either five years' practice after obtaining such qualifications, or ten years' service since completion of internship, whichever of such periods terminates earlier. A fully qualified specialist who under the preceding provisions, is not entitled to the full allowance, shall be paid Rs. 250 per month until such time as he becomes entitled to receive the full allowance as specified above.

(ii) *Part-qualified full-time specialists—*

- Rs. 250 per month for a period of five years ;
 Rs. 375 per month for a period of ten years thereafter ; and
 Rs. 500 per month during the remainder of his period of service.

To be entitled to the full non-pensionable allowance, a part-qualified full-time specialist shall have obtained such specialist qualifications as are recognised by the Director of Health Services, and have either five years' practice after obtaining such qualifications, or ten years' service since completion of internship, whichever of such periods terminates earlier.

A part-qualified specialist who under the preceding provisions, is not entitled to the full allowance, shall be paid Rs. 125 per month until such time as he becomes entitled to receive the full allowance.

(3) *Qualification Pay*

- (a) Every medical officer commissioned prior to April 16, 1951, shall be entitled to receive qualification pay at such of the following rates as is appropriate to him having regard to his rank :—

Major	Rs. 2.50 per day ;
Lieutenant-Colonel	Rs. 3.50 per day.

- (b) Every medical or dental officer commissioned on or after April 16, 1951, shall be entitled to receive qualification pay under the terms and conditions laid down in the Army Pay Code, provided that, in respect of the same qualification, he is not in receipt of the non-pensionable allowance referred to in paragraph (2) (b) of this regulation.
- (c) Where an officer is promoted to the rank of Colonel or to a rank higher than that of Colonel, and thus becomes ineligible for qualification pay, with the result that there is a reduction in his total emoluments, he shall be entitled to receive the difference between the total emoluments he drew before promotion (when he was entitled to qualification pay) and the total emoluments he will be entitled to after promotion.

(4) Every medical or dental officer shall be entitled to receive all other allowances as are payable to officers in terms of, and under the conditions laid down in, the Army Pay Code.

4. (1) Save as otherwise hereinafter provided the Minutes on Pensions shall apply to every medical or dental officer in like manner as though such officer were a public servant holding a permanent office declared to be pensionable under the said Minutes : Provided however that—

- (a) sections 29A, 30, 31, 31A and 31B of the said Minutes relating to enhanced pensions in cases of injuries received in discharge of duty shall not apply to a medical or dental officer ; and
- (b) section 2B of the said Minutes shall apply to a medical or dental officer only if no award is payable to such officer under the regulations relating to " Disability Pensions " contained in the Army Pensions and Gratuities Code.

(2) The regulations relating to " Disability Pensions " contained in the Army Pensions and Gratuities Code shall apply to every medical or dental officer.

(3) Where a medical or dental officer was, immediately prior to his appointment to the Army, the holder of a permanent office in the service of the Government of Ceylon declared to be pensionable under the Minutes on Pensions, his pensionable service in such office shall be reckoned for pension. For the purposes of this paragraph, " pensionable service " shall mean all service that is admissible for the award of a pension or gratuity under the Minutes on Pensions.

PART III—APPOINTMENTS AND PROMOTIONS

5. Every medical or dental officer of the Army shall on appointment be commissioned in the rank of Captain.

6. (1) A medical or dental officer who has served in the Army for a period of eight years shall, on the recommendation of the Commander of the Army and with the approval of the Governor-General, be promoted to the rank of Major, provided that he has passed such examination as may be determined in that behalf by the Commander of the Army.

(2) All previous commissioned embodied service as a medical or dental officer in the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth shall be counted in computing the period of eight years referred to in paragraph (1) of this regulation.

7. Promotion to the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel or any higher rank shall be with the approval of the Governor-General and on the recommendation of the Commander of the Army.

8. Notwithstanding the provisions of regulations 6 and 7 of these regulations, the Commander of the Army may, in such circumstances as he may deem exceptional, determine the rank of a medical or dental officer. Every such determination shall be made with the concurrence of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Defence and External Affairs, and with the approval of the Governor-General.

PART IV—GENERAL

9. The Army Pay Code, the Army Leave and Holiday Warrants Regulations and the Regulations for Officers shall, in so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of these regulations, apply to every medical or dental officer in the Army.

10. The rates of pay and allowances of medical and dental officers of the Army shall be revised to equate them to those recommended and accepted at any future date for medical and dental officers in the Department of Health Services.

11. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

" Army " means the army raised and maintained under the Army Act, No. 17 of 1949 ;

" Army Leave and Holiday Warrants Regulations " means the Army Leave and Holiday Warrants Regulations which are for the time being in force ;

" Army Pay Code " means the Army Pay Code which is for the time being in force ;

" Army Pensions and Gratuities Code " means the Army Pensions and Gratuities Code which is for the time being in force ;

" dental officer " means a dental officer who holds a commission in the Regular Force, and includes a dental officer of the Volunteer Force who is called out on active service or for military training under the provisions of the Army Act, No. 17 of 1949 ;

" fully-qualified full-time specialist " and " part-qualified full-time specialist " have the same meanings as these expressions have when used with reference to medical and dental officers of the Department of Health Services ;

" medical officer " means a medical officer who holds a commission in the Regular Force, and includes a medical officer of the Volunteer Force who is called out on active service or for military training under the provisions of the Army Act, No. 17 of 1949 ;

" Minutes on Pensions " means the Minutes on Pensions made by the Governor and dated February 5, 1934, as amended subsequently ;

" Regular Force " and " Volunteer Force " have the same meanings as in the Army Act, No. 17 of 1949 ; and

" Regulations for Officers " means the regulations relating to officers of the Army which are for the time being in force.

12. The Army Medical and Dental Officers Regulations, 1959, published in *Gazette* No. 11,929 of October 30, 1959, are hereby rescinded.

THE NAVY ACT, No. 34 OF 1950

REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs under section 161 of the Navy Act, No. 34 of 1950.

Regulations

1. These regulations may be cited as the Navy Medical and Dental Officers Regulations, 1961.

PART I—PAY

2. The pay of medical and dental officers in the Navy shall be determined in accordance with the following provisions :—

(A) MEDICAL OFFICERS

- (1) A medical officer, who immediately prior to his appointment as such, was in Government Service, shall, on such appointment, be placed by the Captain of the Navy at such point in the scale of pay specified in paragraph (3) of this regulation as will enable him to draw a pay which is not less than the pay he was last drawing as a Government Officer. Thereafter, his pay shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate provisions of that scale, irrespective of his rank.
- (2) A medical officer other than a medical officer referred to in paragraph (1) shall, on his appointment, be placed at a point in the scale of pay specified in paragraph (3) of this regulation which shall be determined by the Captain of the Navy with the approval of the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury having regard to such officer's professional experience and thereafter his pay shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate provisions of that scale, irrespective of his rank.
- (3) (A) The scale of pay applicable to medical officers shall be as follows :—
- (i) *Preliminary Grade*
Rs. 5,880 per annum rising to Rs. 6,240 per annum by one annual increment of Rs. 360.
 - (ii) *Grade II*
Rs. 6,960 per annum rising to Rs. 11,280 per annum by four annual increments of Rs. 360 each and six annual increments of Rs. 480 each.
 - (iii) *Grade I*
Rs. 11,760 per annum rising to Rs. 13,200 per annum by three annual increments of Rs. 480 each.
 - (iv) *Special Grade*
Rs. 13,800 per annum rising to Rs. 15,600 each per annum by three annual increments of Rs. 600 each.
 - (v) *Full-time Specialists*
 - (a) *Fully qualified full-time specialists*—
A fully-qualified specialist shall be paid the same pay as is payable to a medical officer in the Preliminary Grade, Grade II or Grade I, the Grade being determined in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) and he shall be entitled to proceed to a maximum of Rs. 15,600 per annum, by four annual increments of Rs. 600 each after he has reached the maximum of Rs. 13,200 payable to a Grade I medical officer.
 - (b) *Part-qualified full-time specialists*—
A part-qualified specialist shall be paid the same pay as is payable to a medical officer in the Preliminary Grade, Grade II or Grade I, the Grade being determined in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2), and he shall be entitled to proceed to a maximum of Rs. 14,400 per annum by two annual increments of Rs. 600 each after he has reached the maximum of Rs. 13,200 per annum payable to a Grade I medical officer.
- (B) The Preliminary Grade, Grade II and Grade I, shall be on a continuous time scale with a two-year halt on the maximum of Grade II. The Special Grade shall consist of only one post to which may be appointed any medical officer in the Army, Navy or Air Force, if such medical officer—
- (i) is considered to be the most suitable medical officer for the post by virtue of his seniority, ability, qualifications and experience,
 - (ii) holds a rank not below that of Lieutenant-Colonel, Surgeon Commander or Wing Commander, and
 - (iii) has served for not less than three years on the maximum of the scale of salary of Grade I.

- (7) (a) The scale of pay applicable to dental officers shall be as follows :—
- (i) *Grade II*
Rs. 5,160 per annum rising to Rs. 11,280 per annum by nine annual increments of Rs. 360 each and six annual increments of Rs. 480 each with a two-year halt on Rs. 11,280.
 - (ii) *Grade I*
Rs. 11,760 per annum rising to Rs. 13,200 per annum by three annual increments of Rs. 480 each.
- (b) Grade II and I shall be on a continuous time scale with a two-year halt on the maximum of Grade II.

PART II—ALLOWANCES AND PENSIONS

3. The allowances payable to medical and dental officers shall be in accordance with the following provisions :—

(1) *Service Allowance*

A medical or dental officer shall be entitled to receive a service allowance at such of the following rates per month as is appropriate to him having regard to his rank :—

(2) *Non-pensionable Allowance*

A medical officer shall be entitled to receive a non-pensionable allowance, in lieu of private practice, at the following rates :—

(a) *Non-Specialists*—

- (i) *Preliminary Grade* Rs. 1,200 per annum.
- (ii) *Grade II* Rs. 1,200 per annum for the first six years and Rs. 1,800 per annum thereafter.

- (iii) *Grade I* Rs. 1,800 per annum for the first four years.
 Rs. 2,400 per annum for the next four years after the first four years.
 Rs. 3,000 per annum for the next four years after the first eight years.
 Rs. 3,600 per annum thereafter.
- (iv) *Special Grade* Rs. 1,800 per annum.

(b) *Full-time Specialists*

(i) *Fully-qualified full-time specialists—*

- Rs. 500 per month for a period of five years ;
 Rs. 750 per month for a period of ten years thereafter ; and
 Rs. 1,000 per month during the remainder of his period of service.

To be entitled to the full non-pensionable allowance, a fully-qualified full-time specialist shall have obtained such specialist qualifications as are recognised by the Director of Health Services and have either five years' practice after obtaining such qualifications or ten years' service since completion of internship, whichever of such periods terminates earlier. A fully-qualified specialist who under the preceding provisions is not entitled to the full allowance, shall be paid Rs. 250 per month until such time as he becomes entitled to receive the full allowance as specified above.

(ii) *Part-qualified full-time specialists—*

- Rs. 250 per month for a period of five years ;
 Rs. 375 per month for a period of ten years thereafter ; and
 Rs. 500 per month during the remainder of his period of service.

To be entitled to the full non-pensionable allowance, a part-qualified full-time specialist shall have obtained such specialist qualifications as are recognised by the Director of Health Services and have either five years' practice after obtaining such qualifications or ten years' service since completion of internship, whichever of such periods terminates earlier.

A part-qualified specialist who under the preceding provisions is not entitled to the full allowance, shall be paid Rs. 125 per month until such time as he becomes entitled to receive the full allowance as specified above.

(3) *Qualification Pay*

- (a) Every medical officer commissioned prior to April 16, 1951, shall be entitled to receive qualification pay at such of the following rates as is appropriate to him having regard to his rank :—

Lieutenant-Commander	Rs. 2.50 per day ;
Commander	Rs. 3.50 per day.

- (b) Every medical or dental officer commissioned on or after April 16, 1951, shall be entitled to receive qualification pay under the terms and conditions laid down in the Navy Pay Code, provided that, in respect of the same qualification he is not in receipt of the non-pensionable allowance referred to in paragraph (2) (b) of this regulation.

- (c) Where an officer is promoted to the rank of Captain or to a rank higher than that of Captain and thus becomes ineligible for qualification pay with the result that there is a reduction in his total emoluments, he shall be entitled to receive the difference between the total emoluments he drew before promotion (when he was entitled to qualification pay) and the total emoluments he will be entitled to after promotion.

- (4) Every medical or dental officer shall be entitled to receive all other allowances as are payable to officers in terms of, and under the conditions laid down in the Navy Pay Code.

4. (1) Same as otherwise hereinafter provided the Minutes on Pensions shall apply to every medical or dental officer in like manner as though such officer were a public servant holding a permanent office declared to be pensionable under the said Minutes :

(2) Where a medical or dental officer was, immediately prior to his appointment to the Navy, the holder of a permanent office in the service of the Government of Ceylon declared to be pensionable under the Minutes on Pensions, his pensionable service in such office shall be reckoned for pension. For the purposes of this paragraph, "pensionable service" shall mean all service that is admissible for the award of a pension or gratuity under the Minutes on Pensions.

PART III—APPOINTMENTS AND PROMOTIONS.

5. Every medical or dental officer of the Navy shall on appointment be commissioned in the rank of Lieutenant.

6. (1) A medical or dental officer who has served in the Navy for a period of eight years shall, on the recommendation of the Captain of the Navy and with the approval of the Governor-General, be promoted to the rank of Lieutenant-Commander, provided that he has passed such examination as may be determined in that behalf by the Captain of the Navy.

(2) All previous commissioned embodied service as a medical or dental officer in the Armed Forces of the British Commonwealth shall be counted in computing the period of eight years referred to in paragraph (1) of this regulation.

7. Promotion to the rank of Commander or to any higher rank shall be with the approval of the Governor-General and on the recommendation of the Captain of the Navy.

8. Notwithstanding the provisions of regulations 6 and 7 of these regulations, the Captain of the Navy may, in such circumstances as he may deem exceptional, determine the rank of a medical or dental officer. Every such determination shall be made with the concurrence of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Defence and External Affairs, and with the approval of the Governor-General.

PART IV—GENERAL

9. The Navy Pay Code, the Navy Leave and Holiday Warrants Regulations, and the Regulations for Officers shall, in so far as they are not inconsistent with the provisions of these regulations, apply to every medical or dental officer of the Navy.

10. The rates of pay and allowances of medical and dental officers of the Navy shall be revised to equate them to those recommended and accepted at any future date for medical and dental officers in the Department of Health Services.

"dental officer" means a dental officer who holds a commission in the Regular Naval Force, and includes a dental officer of the Volunteer Naval Force who is called out on active service or for naval training under the provisions of the Navy Act, No. 34 of 1950 ;

"fully-qualified full-time specialist" and "part-qualified full-time specialist" have the same meanings as these expressions have when used with reference to medical and dental officers of the Department of Health Services ;

"Navy" means the Navy raised and maintained under the Navy Act, No. 34 of 1950 ;

"Navy Leave and Holiday Warrants Regulations" means the Navy Leave and Holiday Warrants Regulations which are for the time being in force ;

- "Navy Pay Code" means the Navy Pay Code which is for the time being in force ;
 "Navy Pensions and Gratuities Code" means the Navy Pensions and Gratuities Code which is for the time being in force ;
 "medical officer" means a medical officer who holds a commission in the Regular Naval Force, and includes a medical officer of the Volunteer Naval Force who is called out on active service or for naval training under the provisions of the Navy Act, No. 34 of 1950 ;
 "Minutes on Pensions" means the Minutes on Pensions made by the Governor and dated February 5, 1934, as amended subsequently ;
 "Regular Naval Force" and "Volunteer Naval Force" have the same meanings as in the Navy Act, No. 34 of 1950 ; and
 "Regulations for Officers" means the regulations relating to officers of the Navy which are for the time being in force.

Regulations

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Force Medical and Dental Officers Regulations, 1961.

PART I—PAY

2. The pay of medical and dental officers in the Air Force shall be determined in accordance with the following provisions :—

- (1) A medical officer, who immediately prior to his appointment as such, was employed in Government Service, shall, on such appointment, be placed by the Commander of the Air Force at such point in the scale of pay specified in paragraph (3) of this regulation as will enable him to draw a pay which is not less than the pay he was last drawing as a government officer. Thereafter, his pay shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate provisions of that scale, irrespective of his rank.
- (2) A medical officer other than a medical officer referred to in paragraph (1) shall, on his appointment, be placed at a point in the scale of pay specified in paragraph (3) of this regulation which shall be determined by the Commander of the Air Force with the approval of the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury having regard to such officers' professional experience ; and thereafter his pay shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate provisions of that scale, irrespective of his rank.
- (3) (A) The scale of pay applicable to medical officers shall be as follows :—
- (i) *Preliminary Grade*
Rs. 5,880 per annum rising to Rs. 6,240 per annum by one annual increment of Rs. 360.
 - (ii) *Grade II*
Rs. 6,960 per annum rising to Rs. 11,280 per annum by four annual increments of Rs. 360 each and six annual increments of Rs. 480 each.
 - (iii) *Grade I*
Rs. 11,760 per annum rising to Rs. 13,200 per annum by three annual increments of Rs. 480 each.
 - (iv) *Special Grade*
Rs. 13,800 per annum rising up to Rs. 15,600 per annum by three annual increments of Rs. 600 each.
 - (v) *Full-time Specialists*
 - (a) *Fully-qualified full-time specialists—*
A fully qualified specialist shall be paid the same pay as is payable to a medical officer in the Preliminary Grade, Grade II or Grade I, the Grade being determined in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2), and he shall be entitled to proceed to a maximum of Rs. 15,600 per annum by four annual increments of Rs. 600 each after he has reached the maximum of Rs. 13,200 payable to a Grade I medical officer.
 - (b) *Part-qualified full-time specialists—*
A part-qualified specialist shall be paid the same pay as is payable to a medical officer in the Preliminary Grade, Grade II or Grade I, the Grade being determined in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2), and he shall be entitled to proceed to a maximum of Rs. 14,400 per annum by two annual increments of Rs. 600 each after he has reached the maximum of Rs. 13,200 per annum payable to a Grade I medical officer.
- (B) The Preliminary Grade, Grade II and Grade I, shall be on a continuous time scale with a two-year halt on the maximum of Grade II. The Special Grade shall consist of only one post to which may be appointed any medical officer in the Air Force, Army or Navy, if such medical officer—
- (i) is considered to be the most suitable medical officer for the post by virtue of his seniority, ability, qualifications and experience,
 - (ii) holds a rank not below that of Wing Commander, Surgeon Commander or Lieutenant-Colonel, and
 - (iii) has served for not less than three years on the maximum of the scale of salary of Grade I.
- (4) An officer appointed to act in a post in a higher grade than his own shall be entitled to receive, acting pay in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Government.

(B) DENTAL OFFICERS

- (5) A dental officer, who immediately prior to his appointment as such, was in Government Service, shall on such appointment, be placed by the Commander of the Air Force at such point in the scale of pay specified in paragraph (7) of this regulation as will enable him to draw a pay which is not less than the pay he was last drawing as a government officer. Thereafter, his pay shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate provisions of that scale, irrespective of his rank.

(6) A dental officer other than a dental officer referred to in paragraph (5) shall, on his appointment, be placed at a point in the scale of pay specified in paragraph (7) of this regulation which shall be determined by the Commander of the Air Force with the approval of the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury having regard to such officer's professional experience; and thereafter his pay shall be determined in accordance with the appropriate provisions of that scale, irrespective of his rank.

(7) (a) The scale of pay applicable to dental officers shall be as follows :—

(i) *Grade II*

Rs. 5,160 per annum rising to Rs. 11,280 per annum by nine annual increments of Rs. 360 each and six annual increments of Rs. 480 each with a 2 years' halt on Rs. 11,280.

(ii) *Grade I*

Rs. 11,760 per annum rising to Rs. 13,200 per annum by three annual increments of Rs. 480 each.

(b) Grades II and I shall be on a continuous time scale with a two-year halt on the maximum of Grade II.

PART II—ALLOWANCES AND PENSIONS

3. The allowances payable to medical and dental officers shall be in accordance with the following provisions :—

(4) Every medical or dental officer shall be entitled to receive all other allowances as are payable to officers in terms of, and under the conditions laid down in, the Air Force Pay Code.

4. (1) Save as otherwise hereinafter provided the Minutes on Pensions shall apply to every medical or dental officer in like manner as though such officer were a public servant holding a permanent office declared to be pensionable under the said Minutes :
